

Help Stop the Quarry - Donate NOW!

Hi All,

We are rapidly nearing a critical point in our fight to stop a quarry being built next to Barford.

Contrary to popular belief, no final decision has been made.

There is everything to fight for, but our window of opportunity is narrowing.

Key Points to remember are:

- The quarry is to be built on the A429 next to Barford and running down to the turn off for Charlecote. It is massive.
- Dust from the quarry is on a direct flightpath to Barford. There is nothing to shelter us and the site is 350m away from the village. Silica dust causes serious lung disease and can kill.
- The A429 will be further blocked by an additional 60 lorries per day, plus extra slow lorries to try to dampen down the dust, plus innumerable site vehicle movements.
 - The quarry will be operational for 10 years, maybe longer.
- It's an eyesore. We will lose our beautiful green fields and our environment and heritage will be permanently destroyed.
- This land will never be restored to its current agricultural value. It is likely that the land will then be developed as some sort of water feature, or as housing.

Your donations are now urgently required.

It is time to act as a community to stop the quarry.

In addition to the reports already commissioned and submitted to WCC, we now need advice and a report from Mineral Planning experts. We will also potentially need to employ a barrister to fight on our behalf. And of course, we need the funds to be able to do this.
